Term Two Show and Share Timetable

Our show and share program for Term Two will continue using the same format as last term. We encourage you to remind your child about the Show and Share topic for the week. We would anticipate that these topics would provide time for some lovely interaction at home as you support your child in planning for their turn. Our Integrated Studies topics for Term Two are "Earth's Resources" and "Push and Pull" so we have incorporated one of the topics into our speaking and listening program. The students are not asked to simply bring along something different and special to share with their classmates.

Week 1	<u>My Holiday -</u> Talk about your holiday and some of the fun activities you took part in. Try and find a photograph or draw a picture showing something you did on your holiday.
Week 2	<u>YEAR 2 CAMP</u> <u>(NO SHOW AND SHARE)</u>
Week 3	<u>My Favourite Sport-</u> A chance to talk about your favourite sport. Maybe you could bring in a photo of you playing a sport. Tell us why you like that sport and some of the things you need to know to play this sport.
Week 4	<u>Favourite Animal</u> Tell us what your favourite animal is and why it is your favourite animal.
Week 5	<u>Favourite Bible Character.</u> Tell us about your favourite Bible character and why this person means so much to you.
Week 6	<u>Someone who means a lot to me.</u> This is a chance for you to chat about someone in your life that means a lot to you and why they mean a lot to you.
Week 7	<u>Favourite Season</u> Show or share an interesting fact about one of the four seasons. Explain to us why you like this season.
Week 8	<u>Favourite Song.</u> You could either sing your favourite song or bring it in on a CD to play for everyone. You need to be able to share why you like this song so much.
Week 9	<u>Favourite Book</u> Bring in your favourite book. You may like to read part of it to your classmates or you could tell us about the story and why you like it.
Week 10	<u>Integrated Studies Topic: Push and Pull</u> Children can bring along a toy or an everyday object from home and explain what makes their object move.
